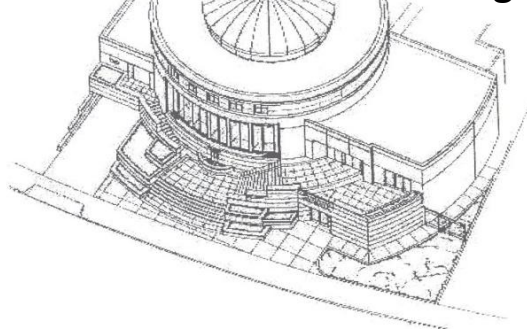

Dear Friends,

As we approach the season of Lent, that time of introspection and renewal that leads to the High Holiday of Easter - the Celebration of the Resurrection - you are invited to take part in **New and Renew**, a devotional, sermon, and commitment series during which you can renew your commitment and relationship to God and also to the United Methodist Church, through a renewal of your membership vows.



If you've been worshipping with us here at Lake Merritt UMC for awhile, now is your time to formally join the fellowship of this great congregation.

Over the past month, the leaders of this congregation have been talking about growth. During these rapidly changing times, when people's lives are busy and when commitment to a church has less and less meaning, being part of a "church" has less and less meaning to many people. To be part of **New and Renew**, you will need to be willing and able to commit to:

*Every day during Lent, February 22-April 7, 2012, light a candle and pray for the nations of the world, for the people and ministry of Lake Merritt UMC, and for all who are facing illness, loss, change, hunger, war, poverty, violence. Include prayers for your own needs.

*Attend all six Lenten Sunday worship services: February 26, March 4, March 11, March 18, March 25 and Palm Sunday, April 1.

During the season of Lent, we will be focusing together as a congregation on: **"Walk the Talk: Prayers, Presence, Gifts, Service, and Witness during Lent."** During each worship service, you will be invited to quietly reflect on how you are living out your membership vows. If you are not yet a member of LMUMC, this will be a time to learn about the UMC and to reflect on your faith, and on whether you will choose to become a member of this congregation.

*Join together for a potluck and time of reflection on April 1, Palm Sunday, after worship, in the Stark Room. After we share a meal together, we will break into small groups to talk about what we have learned during Lenten worship and how each one of us can begin - or deepen - our relationship with God and with this congregation. Childcare will be provided.

*Be present on Easter Sunday, April 8, during worship to be received as a **New** or as a **Renew** member of Lake Merritt UMC.

FINANCE CORNER

The Finance Committee is pleased to announce that the total congregational contributions for 2011 were \$144,920.04, which exceeded the budget (\$141,400) by \$3,520.96. We thank you.

The first meeting of the Finance Committee for 2012 was held on January 14, and we set the budget for the year. A decision was made to keep income more in line with actual expenses. This will be achieved by increases in congregational contributions, rental income, and requests to the Oakland Methodist Foundation for grants.

Our New Series: Dead Sea Scrolls

The Dead Sea Scrolls contain not only our oldest copies of the Bible but Jewish texts that provide an unprecedented view of Jewish history, culture, and religion from before and during the time of Jesus. Professor Gary A. Rendsburg will take us through this study. He holds the Blanche and Irving Laurie chair in Jewish History in the Department of Jewish Studies at Rutgers University. The author of 6 books and more than 120 scholarly articles, Professor Rendsburg has visited Qumran, the site of the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls, many times over the span of several decades.

FOOD PANTRY NEWS AND NEEDS

In this edition of our occasional Food Pantry News, I want to highlight the behind the scenes work of Bob Moorhead and Terry Wade who are our volunteer food pantry shoppers. Six times a month or more, before 7:30am, one or both of them drive to the Alameda County Community Food Bank office near the airport to purchase and bring back the food that we distribute. Just driving to the airport six times a month at 7:30am is daunting enough, but to really appreciate what they do, you need a little more background.

Last year we distributed about 6,755 bags of food that fed approximately 17,475 people. The ACCFB has reported to us that in 2011 we gave away 77,750 pounds of food, 21,337 of which was fresh produce. Our church paid a little more than \$9,000 for that food, which, if purchased at Safeway or Trader Joe's, would have cost almost \$92,000.

So, here's the complete picture: in 2011, Terry and Bob, with assistance from Bernard Dixon when he's been available, transported 77,750 pounds of food from the ACCFB to our church. First, they literally filled their cars up with food each time they made a shopping run, and then when they got to LMUMC they unloaded and stored it so that it could be packed into shopping bags for our food pantry distributions. This essential service they gladly do, without any thought of acknowledgement, for our community and our church because, as Bob said after our last food pantry meeting, "I love this food pantry."

And here's the Food Pantry's first need: We need someone to step forward to serve as a back-up shopper for Bob and Terry to relieve them when needed. The main requirements are that you be available early Tuesday or Friday mornings and able to lift about 30 pounds. If you're interested, please talk with Bob Moorhead, Terry Wade or myself.



Another person who volunteers behind the scenes is Rose Lynn Abesamis-Bell. Every second and fourth week of the month Rose Lynn goes to Noah's Bagels on College Avenue and Semifreddi's Bakery in Alameda to pick up bagels and loaves of bread for our food distribution. We don't have a count of how many bagels and loaves of bread she has delivered, but it's a lot!

And so, here's the Food Pantry's second need: We need someone to step forward to relieve Rose Lynn because . . . she's going on pregnancy leave (yay!). If you're interested, please contact Rose Lynn via email at roselynn20@gmail.com for instructions on how to pick up the bread.

Thank you to everyone in the church for the many ways you support the food pantry.

Super Stars Literacy is a non-profit organization that boosts early literacy and social and emotional development in low performing students through a daily after school program. We serve up to 420 students in kindergarten through second grades in nine Title I elementary schools in Oakland and Hayward. Our students and families come from some of the region's poorest and most underserved areas.

We need your help. The most formative time in a student's learning is the first three years of school. Poor literacy skills in K through 2nd grades place students at a serious disadvantage for the rest of their school years, a setback they may never recover from. Volunteering your time in one of our classrooms, at a special event, on a field trip, or in our office, can help change the trajectory of a student's academic life forever.

- **Classroom Volunteer:** Tutor a struggling reader in an after school program near you
